From its creation in 1965 as the Portsmouth Community Trust, the Southeast Virginia Community Foundation successfully completed its 58th year in 2023 by fulfilling our mission of Connecting Donors to Causes that Matter. In celebrating the success, we are very proud to present the Annual Report for 2023.

We are pleased to report that the Foundation's value of our net assets showed a modest increase to just under \$17 million. We received contributions for a total of over \$858k while adding four new Funds.

We continued to support the community with over \$968,000 in grants awarded to local non-profits and offering 38 scholarships to high school students valued at \$77K.

The Board of Directors welcomed new board members, Bett Cornetta, Executive Producer with BHC and Associates and Dr. Joe Rampersad, Executive Director at the Grandy Street YMCA of South Hampton Roads.

The 2023 year can be considered a success for the Foundation, and the coming years bring with it both challenges and opportunities.





2023 FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

The Southeast Virginia Community Foundation holds itself to high standards of financial management and transparency, and operates efficiently for the interest of our community. Financial overview is for the year ending December 31, 2023.





Starr Oliver is Still Making a Difference in Hampton Roads

The beginning of TowneBank is the stuff of local legend. In the "room over Bob Aston's garage" back in 1998, the founders said they hoped to raise \$30 million from 400 local investors. Instead, 4000 pledged \$50-million, and 6 months later, Towne was in business. Today it has 51 branches across Virginia and North Carolina plus insurance, mortgage, benefits and more in a Financial

Services Division.

"I started as a teller at Citizens Trust Bank in Portsmouth in 1974 when Bob was head of the installment loan department," Starr recalls. "I could tell then that he had big ambitions." And she had a front row seat along the way working side by side for Aston in a host of roles including marketing and human resources until her retirement

in 2019. "I always thought Bob and I would call it quits at the same time, but he outlasted me!"

Now retired with husband Michael and doting on their first grandchild, Starr can still be found in the shadows of her beloved TowneBank. Her financial acumen, and devotion to the region, led her to establish a Donor Advised Fund at SEVACF. "It has helped me to direct my philanthropy to non-profits that are important to me." Those have included Churchland Baptist Church, the Southeastern Virginia Food Bank, and Achievable Dream, just to name a few.

Her principal focus now, though, is "feet on the street" organizations that have limited resources but large challenges, like GiveBack2DaBlock. "My friend Susan Pilato introduced me to Darrell Redmond," who created GiveBack. "A former state

> prison inmate who came home to Portsmouth, Darrell risks his life and gives his heart and soul every day to break the cycle of violence," says Oliver, who now serves on Darrell's board. "I marvel at how he tackles conflict de-escalation, fosters peace and builds positive empowerment. He is called upon constantly by the city, social services, etc. when gun violence occurs. For real change though,

Darrell could be even more effective with a seat at the 'prevention solution' table."

"We must do better as a society to acknowledge that hurt people hurt people," she says. "We must listen to these residents, have tough conversations and be open to practical solutions." Through her time and disbursements from her SEVACF fund, Starr Oliver is using the skills she developed in her career to bring attention to those often ignored so that real solutions can be implemented. She would like to see others take an interest and join her.

SEVACF Helps Crush Cancer Through Unique Cycling Event

When Rosemary Wilson lost her husband of over 37 years, Tom, to anaphylactic thyroid cancer in 2013, she mourned, and then did something important in his honor.

"In 2014, I attended an event in Washington where people on stationary bikes rode to raise money for research into the causes

and cures for rare cancers like the one that took Tom's life," she recalls. "It was put on by Memorial Sloan Kettering Institute's Cancer Center in New from trainers and enjoying being with their fellow employees," says Wilson. She serves on a volunteer committee that puts this together each year, not a non-profit so Crush Cancer needed one to house the money and pay out expenses. Enter SEVACF.

"The Foundation has

been invaluable," says Mark Rosenfield, who represents McLeskey and owner Cheryl McLeskey on the organizing committee. McLeskey was a

York and was both fun and very successful. I said, 'why can't we do one here?"

Rosemary, vice mayor of the City of Va Beach and on its Council since 2000, approached Armada Hoffler President Tony Nero, who had lost his wife to cancer, about it. "I'm in," he said. A partnership with Sloan Kettering was formed, and Crush Cancer was born, first held in 2015 at Onelife Fitness on Virginia Beach Boulevard. After a COVID pause, the site shifted to the Cavalier Golf & Yacht Club.

"We have raised \$2.3 million over the past decade thanks to teams of men and women who were peddling with encouragement

founding sponsor because it owns the shopping center in which Onelife Fitness resides. "Cheryl's husband Wayne also died of cancer, so we are big advocates of Crush Cancer (www.letscrushcancer.org)."

Mark was on the mic throughout a beautiful afternoon on the water at the Cavalier, encouraging the cyclists and reminding them of the critical cause they were helping.

Crush Cancer 2024 netted almost \$180,000. This fall, planning for 2025 will begin. "50% of all cancers are considered rare, and those are what Sloan Kettering studies," says Wilson. "We are proud to support their efforts."

At SEVACF, so are we.

SEVACF Scholarship Fund Honors the Memory of a Beloved Chesapeake Son, Friend and Actor

"We miss Mason terribly," says his father, "which is why we hope the scholarship fund through SEVACF, which has been a wonderful partner, will continue to grow."

Back in late July 2019, when 16-year-old Mason Hackworth complained to his parents of what seemed like routine heartburn with nausea, David and Mary Beth gave him Tums.

But the symptoms persisted. Indeed two days later, Mason threw up. "He told me he was really starting to feel bad," says Mary Beth. She took her son to an urgent care on August 3, which diagnosed him as having GERD, Gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD) that occurs when stomach acid repeatedly flows back into the esophagus. They prescribed a nausea medication.

Three days later, when Mason didn't come downstairs, Mary Beth figured he was sleeping in after a long night. When she went into his room, Mason was dead. An autopsy revealed the teen had Viral Myocarditis, an inflammation of the heart muscle that impairs the organ's ability to pump blood. "His body was fighting a very serious virus, but they missed it through their misdiagnosis," says Mary Beth. "If they had recommended we take him to the emergency room, perhaps his life could have been saved."

Mason was special, say his parents and lone sibling, his sister Morgan, now studying accounting at ODU. "He loved to play and watch sports but also to sing, particularly numbers by groups like the Beatles and Chicago," she says. "He was an old soul." And like his sister, Mason loved to act. He was in many shows in elementary school, and when he scored a lead in a production, David and Mary Beth cancelled a planned

> Disney Cruise so he wouldn't miss it. Mason took some years off, reemerging as a sophomore at Grassfield High School in Chesapeake to earn a part in Fiddler on the Roof. "It wasn't a big role," recalls Mom, "but he was really into it."

That's also when Mason became friendly with Gavin White, a year older but very focused on an acting career. "Mason was one of those people you just get drawn to and want to know better," he

remembers. "He had a wonderful personality, and I figured we would be friends for a long time." Gavin, now 22, works part-time as a costumed character at theme parks in Florida while finishing his degree in acting at Central Florida University.

\$500 of his freshman expenses at CFU were covered by a gift he received back at Grassfield. "I was the first one to receive money from the Mason Hackworth Scholarship Fund," he says. "I was very proud."

When the Hackworths started the fund in Mason's memory, they chose the Southeast Virginia Community Foundation to manage it. "Other arts programs at Grassfield, like choral and orchestra, had scholarship programs, but theater did not. So it filled a void," says

David. "And thankfully our extended family and the community responded with very generous investments."

The family thought the fund might generate one or two \$500 gifts a year, but so much money has come in that today, two students a year are receiving \$1,500 each (or three at a \$1,000 apiece). Morgan is on the committee that reviews the applications and is "amazed at the quality of their essays. We want these students to be able to continue doing what they love."

To qualify, a Grassfield student must be in good academic standing, be in the International Thespian Society, and plan to attend a two- or four-year college. So far sixteen students have won scholarships. Jon Vredenburg is one. "When I received it, it felt like Mason was still looking out for me. I cannot thank the Hackworth family enough for the recognition it gives to students



who exemplify Mason's virtues."

"We miss Mason terribly," says his father, "which is why we hope the scholarship fund through SEVACF, which has been a wonderful partner, will continue to grow." Says daughter Morgan, "it helps keep Mason's memory alive for us."

All third-grade classrooms in Portsmouth, including this one from Churchland Academy Elementary School, visited the

Virginia Zoo in Norfolk last spring, thanks to a \$12,000 grant from SEVACF. "It was the most exciting trip my students had ever been on," said teacher Stephanie Niavez. "Seeing the animals up close really brought to life what we had taught them in school and helped them better understand the different habitats in which they live. It was an amazing experience." Some 900 children and 100 adults were able to visit the Zoo thanks to the SEVACF grant.

Hospital Point Park, Portsmouth, VA Portsmouth, VA Portsmouth (Independent City)

In 1798 the United States Congress passed an act creating the Marine Hospital Service, the forerunner of the Public Health Service, and set up a Naval Hospital Fund to be filled by taking twenty cents a month from the pay of every seaman, officer and marine. When plans developed for establishing a marine hospital, the state of Virginia in 1801 offered to supply an appropriate site and in 1826 the city of Norfolk was selected. In 1827 the Commissioners of the Naval Hospital–the Secretaries of War, Navy and Treasury–picked eighteen acres at Fort Nelson, a fortification built during the Revolution to protect Norfolk and later purchased by the federal government in 1800, as the site of the future hospital. Sixty-one acres were purchased to add to the property and John Haviland, well-known Philadelphia architect, was commissioned to draw plans for the new building.

The Naval Hospital has had distinguished service serving those in need. In 1855 when Portsmouth lost one-fifth of its population in a dreadful Yellow Fever epidemic, over 500 civilians were treated at the hospital. In April, 1862, the Confederate government surrounded the building with earthworks and renamed it Fort Nelson. The next year it was occupied by Northern troops and re-established as a federal army hospital.
