Chesapeake Humane Society RECEIVED \$5,000

Founded in 1972, Chesapeake Humane Society supports the homeless and underserved animals in Hampton Roads and Northeastern North Carolina. In 2021, the nonprofit received a SEVACF grant of \$5,000 to cover expenses for animals in their crisis boarding program. In addition, the money will also pay for costs associated with general care, such as food and supplies, as well as veterinary treatment like vaccines, spay and neuter surgeries, preventative medicine and treatment for fatal illnesses like heartworm disease. The funding will also cover x-rays of animals with abuse injuries in domestic violence cases. SEVACF is proud to support the health and safety of our furry friends!

Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia and the Eastern Shore RECEIVED \$10,000

Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia and the Eastern Shore

Since 1981, the Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia and the Eastern Shore has distributed over 360 million pounds of food equating to over 300 million meals. In July 2021, thanks to a SEVACF grant of \$10,000, the Foodbank introduced a fleet of Mobile Markets to provide healthy, nutritious foods directly to individuals and families with limited resources and low food access. Like a farmer's market, the 757 Mobile Market program allows individuals to peruse an assortment of fresh fruits and vegetables, dairy items, proteins and pantry staples. Kudos to the Foodbank on providing access to seasonal products in such a personalized, innovative format.


SUPPORT SEVACF'S HERITAGE FUND
